Two weeks ago we had the department's strategic planning session in Bela Bela where the department's think tank met to plan the way forward for this newly established Department of Public Works, Roads and Infrastructure. During that two day sitting, I said that session should not be another talk shop whose resolutions would not be implemented, for we are a department in desperate need of resurrection after years of negative audit opinions. We are a department that is knocking on the intensive care unit's door. We must all rise to the occasion and rescue it from further decline downstream.

I come here today after having been to Sekhukhune, Capricorn and Vhembe to meet your colleagues in those district offices, and I must be honest that these visits have been rewarding and fulfilling for me as the Member of the Executive Council responsible for this newly configured Department of Public Works, Roads and Infrastructure. These changes were made to improve on service delivery in line with the developmental

Let us move away from the conventional way of doing things and become creative and innovative in everything we do for us to return this department to what it used to be.
